GUIDELINES FOR PREPARATION OF MANUSCRIPT



Annals of SBV is published twice a year from Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth (SBV, a Deemed University), Puducherry. At present two medical colleges, one dental college and one nursing college are affiliated to this University.



Central Inter-Disciplinary Research Facility is the state of art nodal research center of SBV fostering translational research.

Each issue of the publication will have a major theme and the published articles will be broadly within the theme.

Theme of the present issue is

“Advances in Interdisciplinary Research in Health Sciences”

We invite articles from all faculty and research scholars from India and abroad. The articles can be submitted in the broad field of “Advances in Interdisciplinary Research in Health Sciences”

Types of articles: The articles are welcome under the headings of

- i. Commentary,
- ii. Review articles,
- iii. Original Research Articles and
- iv. Short Reports.

Authors do not have to pay for submission, processing or publication of articles.

ARTICLE SUBMISSION

Generally, the manuscript should be submitted in the form of two separate files:

File 1: Title page, File 2: Article File

1. **Title Page:** should mention the (1) Type of manuscript: review article, original article, etc. (2) Title of the manuscript, running title, names of all authors/ contributors with their highest academic degrees, designation and affiliations and name/s of department/s and/ or institution/s to which the work should be credited. (3) The total number of pages, total number of Tables and Figures (4) Name, address, e-mail, and telephone number of the corresponding author.
2. **Article file:** The main text of the article, beginning from Abstract till References (including tables) should be in this file. The pages should be numbered consecutively, beginning with the first page of the article file. Images can be submitted as jpeg files. Legends for the figures/images should be included at the end of the article file.

PREPARATION OF MANUSCRIPTS

Preparation of Manuscripts

Manuscripts must be prepared in accordance with "Uniform requirements for Manuscripts submitted to Biomedical Journals" developed by the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (October 2008).

Before submitting a manuscript, contributors are requested to check for the latest instructions available www.icmje.org/about-icmje/faqs/icmje-recommendations.

Types of Manuscripts

Commentary: The purpose of a commentary on a topic is to provide varying perspectives and advances on the topic under consideration. It can have up to 2000 words and 8 references.

Review Articles: This will be written on the current area of research interest covering the advances in the field. This will be accompanied by a short summary (250 words) of the article. The total number of words is up to 3000 excluding summary, Tables and references. The manuscript may have about 75 references.

Original articles: The text of original articles amounting to up to 3000 words (excluding Abstract, references and Tables) should be divided into sections with the headings Abstract, Key-words, Introduction, Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, References, Tables and Figure legends.

Short Reports: Short research works, pilot study etc are considered under this heading. It can have up to 1500 words and 6 references.

References

The references are written in "Vancouver style"

References should be *numbered* consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text (not in alphabetic order). *Identify references in text*, tables, and legends by Arabic numerals in superscript with square bracket after the *punctuation marks*. *References cited only* in tables or figure legends should be numbered in

accordance with the sequence established by the first identification in the text of the particular table or figure. Avoid using abstracts as references. Information from manuscripts submitted but not accepted should be cited in the text as "unpublished observations" with written permission from the source.

2. Standard journal article (for more than six authors): List the first six contributors followed by *et al.*

Books and Other Monographs:

3. Personal author(s): Parija SC. Textbook of Medical Parasitology. 3rd ed. All India Publishers and Distributors. 2008.
4. Editor(s), compiler(s) as author: Garcia LS, Filarial Nematodes In: Garcia LS (editor) Diagnostic Medical Parasitology ASM press Washington DC 2007: pp 319-356.
5. Chapter in a book: Nesheim M C. Ascariasis and human nutrition. *In* Ascariasis and its prevention and control, D. W. T. Crompton, M. C. Nesbemi, and Z. S. Pawlowski (eds.). Taylor and Francis, London, U.K. 1989, pp. 87–100.

Tables

1. Tables should be self-explanatory and should not duplicate textual material.
2. Tables with more than 10 columns and 25 rows are not acceptable.

3. Number tables, in Arabic numerals, consecutively in the order of their first citation in the text and supply a brief title for each.
4. Place explanatory matter in footnotes, not in the heading.
5. Obtain permission for all fully borrowed, adapted, and modified tables and provide a credit line in the footnote.
6. For footnotes use the following symbols, in this sequence: *, †, ‡, §, ||, ¶, **, ††, ‡‡
7. The tables along with their number should be cited at the relevant place in the text

Illustrations (Figures)

1. Upload the images in JPEG format.
2. Figures should be numbered consecutively according to the order in which they have been first cited in the text.
3. Labels, numbers, and symbols should be clear and of uniform size. The lettering for figures should be large enough to be legible after reduction to fit the width of a printed column.
4. If a figure has been published elsewhere, acknowledge the original source and submit written permission from the copyright holder to reproduce the material.
5. The Journal reserves the right to crop, rotate, reduce, or enlarge the photographs to an acceptable size.

Plagiarism: Plagiarism is banned and viewed seriously. The authors are advised to follow strict academic ethics. Their manuscript should be checked with Plagiarism checker software before submission to Annals of SBV.
