## **CLINICAL FACILITIES:**

MGMCRI is a multi & super speciality 1350 bedded hospital with Hi-tech laboratories and clinical departments. The hospital beds

are distributed in all the wards with adequate services, housing all the disciplines. It also boasts of well equipped modern operation theatres, Critical Care Units, CSSD, Blood Bank and a Dialysis Unit with sophisticated and life saving devices. The OP department sections have also been designed spaciouly with demonstration rooms for clinical presentation.

Apart from our parent hospital, we have tie up with, Mental health centres in Puducherry, Sacred Heart hospital in Payankulam, Kerala, NIMHANS in Bengaluru, and ATHMA in Trichy to have clinical exposure in Mental Health Nursing.

## **COMMUNITY SERVICES**

MGMCRI operates Four Health Centers, Urban Health Centre at Ariyankuppam (12Kms from MGMCRI) and Rural Health Centres at Seliamedu, Parangipet & Mettupalayam. The Institutes has been allotted to Primary Health Centre by the Directorate of Health and Family Welfare Services, Government of Puducherry. These Primary Health Centres are located in Kirumampakkam & Nettapakkam. Each health centre is endowed with a well equipped laboratory and wards with 5-6 Beds. In addition to OPD services, specialists from the department of Ophthalmology, Dermatology, Venerology & Leprology, Pediatrics, Obstetrics & Gynaecology and Dental hold specialty clinics as per the week schedule in these health centers.

## **HOSTEL DETAILS**

Our campus has beautiful, well structured hostels set in a serene atmosphere within the campus for boys and girls. Hostel rooms are spacious, ventilated & well furnished adequate space to occupy all the students admitted in the institute. Round the clock security is also available. It also boasts of independent rooms, recreation rooms and a dining hall with an attractive ambience. For the good health and safety of every student in the hostel, they are provided with ozone purified drinking water. Hygienically prepared, good quality sumptuous food is provided to the students at a very nominal price. Needless to say,

### **Hostel Rooms**

In the hostel each student is provided with adequate spacious rooms with all the facility.

### **Rest Room**

Fully tiled Bathrooms and Toilets with excellent sanitary fittings and 24 hours water facility are provided for each floor in the student’s hostel.

### **Kitchen & Dining Hall**

A separate central kitchen with 15 cooks caters to the culinary needs of the students in preparing hygienic and nutritious food. The dining hall has all the facilities with adequate chairs, water cooler, refrigerator, heating facilities, hand washing etc.,

### **Fitness and Recreation Facilities**

It has all the facilities like led Wall Mount with dish Television, Wi-Fi connectivity and Indoor games (chess, carom, table tennis etc). Outside the hostel there are modern playing courts for Football, Tennis, Volleyball, Badminton, basketball, throw ball etc., with qualified physical Instructors. Hostel is also provided with a multisystem gymnasium with all the modern equipments.

### **Visitor’s Room:-**

There is a well furnished visitor’s room in the hostel with comfortable seating, lighting and toilet facilities.

### **Washing & Ironing room:-**

There is a separate space for washing, drying and ironing clothes. The students can also make use of the services of Dhobi.

### **Other Services**

Various services are provided for the students and staff to make life easy and comfortable amidst their busy schedule with provision of various facilities like STD/ISD phone booth, Internet, Photocopying, Daily Need Store, Indian Bank 24 hrs ATM along

with Wi-Fi for the students and staff to stay connected and have information.

### **Sick Room:-**

It has comfortable beds, linen, furniture and attached toilet with all the First aid materials and 'Over the Counter medications'.

### **Warden Room:-**

Warden has separate office room besides her residential accommodation.

## **STUDENTS COUNSELLING**

### **STUDENTS' CHARTER**



# Scheme of Examination



## **SELECTION OF STUDENTS**

Selection of the candidate is based on the merit of the entrance examination held by the University or competent authority or as per regulation of the university from time to time.

## **MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION:**

English shall be the medium of instruction.

## **MINIMUM WORKING DAYS IN ACADEMIC YEARS**

Each academic year shall consist of not less than 240 working days

## **REGISTRATION**

A candidate admitted in our institution of the SBV University, shall submit the prescribed fee & declaration in the format to the university within the prescribed date. For NRI candidates, the University has to issue an equivalent certificate as per the regulations.

## **ATTENDANCE REQUIRED FOR APPEARING EXAMINATION**

Examination will be conducted in both theory and practical as prescribed. For appearing at the university examination, student should have 85% attendance in theory and 90% in practical in each subject. Even if shortage seen in one subject, he / she will be detained for the entire examination. Students cannot appear separately for the individual subjects during the first appearance at the professional examination.

- (a) A candidate must complete 100% of attendances notified in each of practical areas before award of degree

## **CONDONATION FOR SHORTAGE OF ATTENDANCE**

Condonation of shortage of attendance in aggregate upto 10% (between 70% - 85%) in each Year may be granted by the college Academic Committee and as per the regulations of university.

## **INTERNAL ASSESSMENT**

Internal assessment will be done in each subject according to the scheme of examinations. The IA marks will be on the basis of the performance in the assignments, class tests, and Practical test in the clinical areas. The methods can be followed by taking from 3 theory and 3 practical examinations of midterm / sessional and model practicals.

## **EXAMINATIONS**

- a) The university examinations will be conducted in Annual pattern for B.Sc (N)/ P.B.B.Sc (N) courses .The particulars of subjects for various examinations and Distribution of marks are detailed in the scheme of examination.
- b) The examination for the main subjects will be conducted by the university and the marks for the internal examination will be awarded by the concerned Head of the Department and the same will be forwarded by the Principal College of Nursing to the university.
- c) The university practical examinations shall be jointly conducted by one internal & one external examiner duly appointed by the university.
- d) Supplementary exams will be held in the month of February / August
- e) For candidates who fail, the number of attempts for examination has been waived off. However to appear for final examination, the candidate shall have cleared all the subjects in the previous examination.
- f) Internship-Before the final exam the students must complete their 6 months internship for B.Sc(N)

## **VACATION**

May - 4 weeks

Dec - 2 weeks

## **ELIGIBILITY / MAXIMUM DURATION FOR THE AWARD OF THE DEGREE**

- a) The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years for B.Sc(N) and 4 years for P.B.B.Sc(N)and M.Sc (N)
- b) A student who does not meet the minimum attendance requirement in a year must compensate the inadequacies before appearing for examination.

## **MARKS REQUIRED FOR A PASS**

**50% of marks in the university Theory examination**

**50% of marks in the university Practical examination**

**50% of marks in the internal examination both in each theory& practical.**

**If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper he/she has to re-appear for both the papers.**

## **DECLARATION OF CLASS**

1. A successful candidate obtaining 75% and more marks in the grand total aggregate in the first attempt shall be declared to have passed with distinction.
2. A successful candidate obtaining 60% and more but less than 75% of marks in the grand total aggregate shall be declared to have passed with first class.
3. A successful candidate obtaining 50% and more but less than 60% of marks in the grand total aggregate shall be declared to have passed with second class.
4. Ranks shall be declared on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained by the candidate in the university examination subjects of the course. Only those candidates who have passed all the subjects in all examination in the first attempt shall be eligible for the award of rank.

## **Rules and regulation of the College and Hospital:**

The institution believes that without good discipline it would not be possible to win academic laurels. Hence the students are instructed to maintain strict discipline to achieve greater heights not only when they are in the campus but also wherever they are in future.

- ❖ Students are required to maintain not only good academic progress but also high discipline in the campus.
- ❖ Any student found guilty of Eve-teasing ( any kind of physical or mental harassment) will be **EXPELLED** from the college and would be handed over to police depending upon the offence committed. **Students indulging in eve teasing will be expelled**
- ❖ Students are not allowed to attend classes or any college function wearing shorts, jeans or t-shirts.
- ❖ **SMOKING AND DRINKING** is prohibited inside the campus
- ❖ Cleanliness of the campus is important. Students should throw the garbage only in the dust-bins provided and should not spit / litter on the walls and floor. Students responsible for loss of damage of the institute property will be severely punished.
- ❖ Students are not permitted to possess or use mobile phones inside the college campus.

## **Responsibility of the students:**

- ❖ To give due respect to the National Anthem, College Anthem Prayer song, faculty, staff, and other elders.
- ❖ To be patient and kind while dealing with patients
- ❖ To maintain a cordial relationship with others.

- ❖ To be punctual for all theory, clinical postings, laboratory and meetings.
- ❖ Students Should wear uniform on all the working days except Saturday
- ❖ Not to possess cell phones during class hours and clinical postings. Not to sit on the parapet walls.
- ❖ To maintain decent dress code (Prescribed Uniforms)
- ❖ Students Should come with clean Shaved and Trimmed nails Students Should not wear Jeans, T-Shirts & Leggings
- ❖ To be with white apron and identity card when in the college and in the hospital campus.
- ❖ To maintain the campus eco - friendly.
- ❖ Should dine in the common room only, not in classrooms.
- ❖ To conserve energy by switching off fans and lights when not in use.
- ❖ All the students should have 100% attendance in theory and Practicals

## **HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- ❖ Nursing is a residential programme all students are required to bring 3 passport size photographs for the hostel admission at the time of counseling
- ❖ The hostel fee/ deposit may be paid at the time of counseling or registration / admission.
- ❖ Every attempt will be made to provide hostel accommodation to all students.
- ❖ It is mandatory for all first year students to stay in the hostels and be a member of the mess in the hostel. In exceptional cases permission may be granted by the Principal to stay out before joining the hostel. Food should not be taken to the rooms.
- ❖ Students must occupy rooms specifically allotted to them. They are not allowed to change rooms except with the written permission of the Chief warden / management.
- ❖ The management / chief warden reserves the right to break open rooms in case of any violation of hostel rules, suspected unlawful activities or on the basis of security risk perceived.
- ❖ Students are requested to avoid singing aloud, shouting or making all types of noises which are likely to distract the attention of those who may be studying in their rooms or hostel libraries.
- ❖ Pets of all kinds are prohibited inside the hostels. Feeding stray dogs or cats in the hostel premises is not permitted.
- ❖ The students are advised not to keep large amount of cash or valuables in the room. The student is responsible for the safety of his or her belongings inside the room.

- ❖ All visitors including parents/ guardians must be entertained only in the visitors lounge and during visiting hours only. A visitor's pass will be obtained from the office of the chief warden, well in advance by concerned student.
- ❖ Any damage /breakage to hostel property will be charged to the occupants of the room / block with a fine. Disciplinary action will also be initiated.
- ❖ Cooking in hostel rooms is not permitted.
- ❖ All instructions / notices displayed on the notice boards will be deemed to have been read by all residents and excuses for non- compliance of such instructions and notices will not be accepted. Residents are advised to look at the notice board everyday to acquaint themselves with latest information / orders.
- ❖ Substance abuse, consumption of alcohol and smoking or chewing of tobacco and its related products is strictly banned in the hostels and in the campus.
- ❖ Partying in the rooms, in the corridors or anywhere in the hostel is not permitted whatever be the occasion.
- ❖ The Chief Warden or his representative may enter any room for verification at anytime of the day or night.
- ❖ All hostel inmates must report any disciplinary matter or problems concerning them or their room – mate / neighbor(s) coming to their notice to the Warden/ Chief Warden through caretaker or directly.
- ❖ No televisions are permitted to be kept in the hostel rooms by the students. Students have to watch TV in the common TV room provided in the hostels.

- ❖ The hostel timings will be strictly adhered to and every student should come to hostel before 6 pm.
- ❖ Students are advised not to keep a vehicle in the campus as it is not necessary.
- ❖ The rooms have been distempered and painted as per schedule and will be maintained regularly by the management as per the maintenance schedule. Students are not permitted to re-paint nor do any alteration of any nature without the written permission of management/ chief warden.
- ❖ The rooms and surroundings must be clean.
- ❖ Water and electricity is an essential but scarce commodity. All students are requested to use water and electricity judiciously and preserve it.
- ❖ All complaints regarding repairs/ maintenance in the hostels must be entered personally by the students in “complaint registers” maintained in all the hostels. These complaints are attended to expeditiously by management staff. All complaints are also monitored regularly by the warden / chief warden.
- ❖ There are “suggestion boxes” kept in all the hostels for suggestions if any from the students. Students may drop their suggestions and complaints if any, duly signed with their names and roll numbers in these suggestion boxes which are opened periodically.
- ❖ If students fall sick, he/she or room-mate / friend must immediately inform the caretakers / warden.

- ❖ Lock your room with a good branded lock. Lock your room always, even when going out for short durations.
- ❖ The management/ chief warden can remove a resident from the hostel at anytime on disciplinary grounds. Students may be required on disciplinary grounds to vacate their rooms at short notice.
- ❖ Ragging in any form is banned inside and outside the campus. Strict action will be taken against the defaulters. No leniency will be shown to the offenders. Suspension and or withdrawal from the hostel / college is one of the actions taken promptly. Punishment for ragging under the act of 1983 can be upto one year imprisonment. Supreme Court has also defined ragging as a criminal offence.

- \* Is an offence which is Prohibited by the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Supreme Court of India
- \* Is a Punishable offence as per the rules and regulation of Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth.




